### Paris





## Some Things I Learned

- Tipping is not commonplace in France, and tax is included within the price of meals!
- The water cups are very small at all restaurants, and they sometimes make you pay for water so make sure you say
  you would like tap water!
- Saying "you're welcome" is not as common in France, so if there is no response when you say, Merci, you should not be offended!
- Students studying in college do not have to pay for their schooling in France! The students liked to joke that we were a lot more serious about our education than them for that reason!
- I didn't know this, but in Switzerland, they speak some Italian, some German, and some French, depending on what city you are in!
- You have to ask to receive your bill at restaurants in Europe, and meals typically last a lot longer and are not as rushed.
- Athletic wear is not as commonly worn in public, and people dress a lot nicer in general!
- There are McDonald's restaurants everywhere, and I had a lot more burgers than I thought I would on the trip
- People, for the most part, are a lot nicer than people generally expect people to be in France (the stereotype that French people are rude is generally not true!)
- Driving is very confusing and there are a lot of roundabouts and weird intersections (I did not drive, but just by observing). The cars are so much smaller than they are in America, too!
