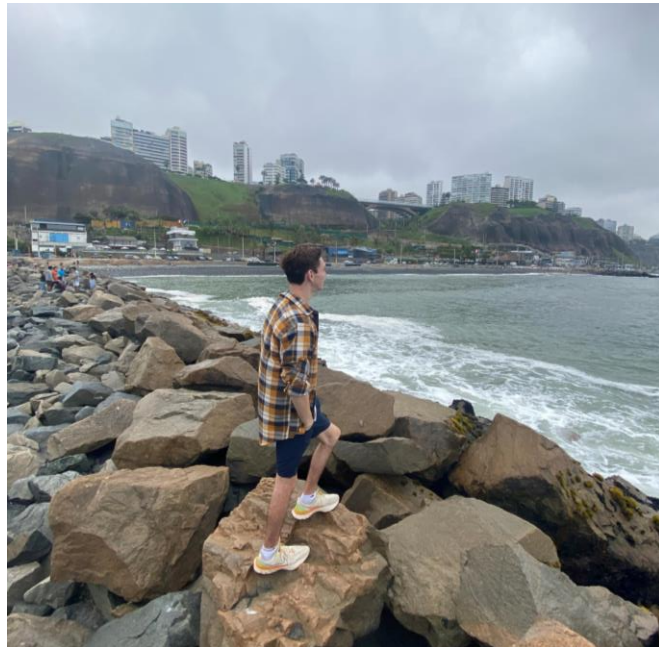

# Exploring Lima pt. 1

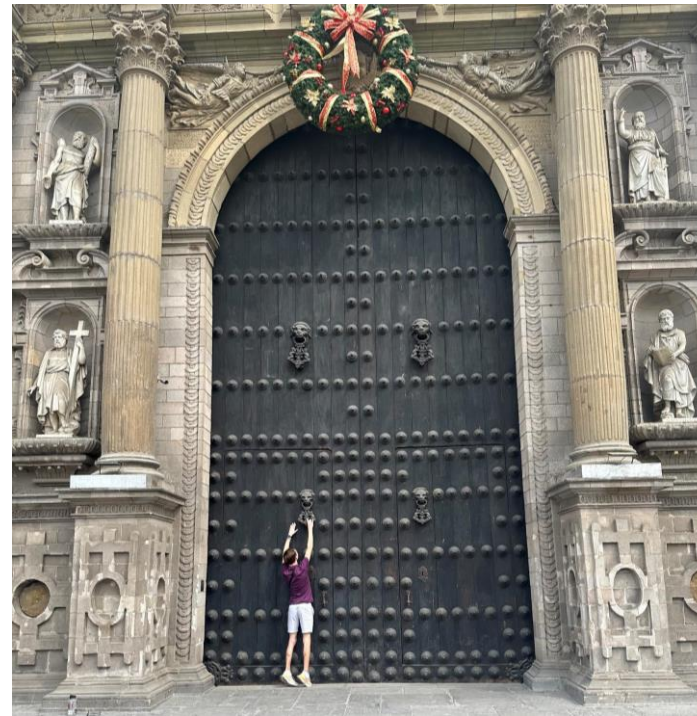


- Lima was a very vibrant city with many beautiful sites

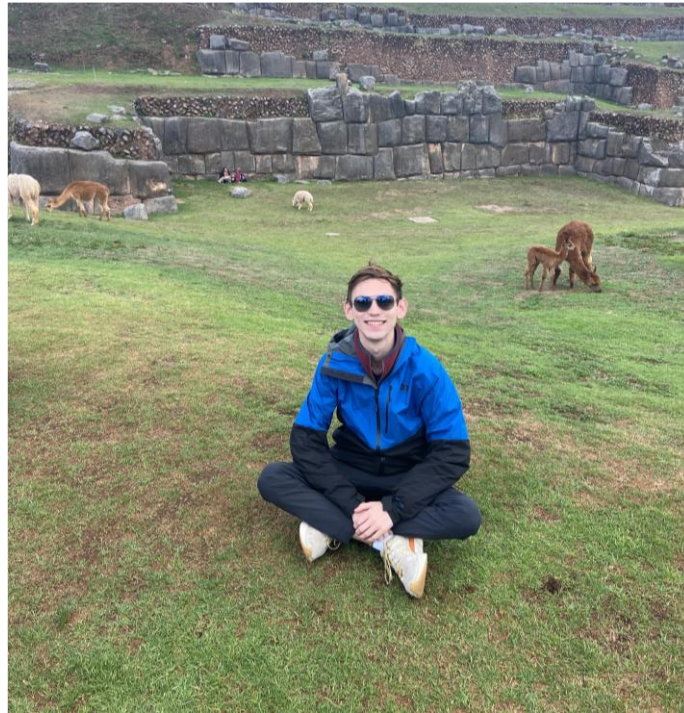


# Larco Museum

- The café at the restaurant was one of my favorite meals I had in Peru

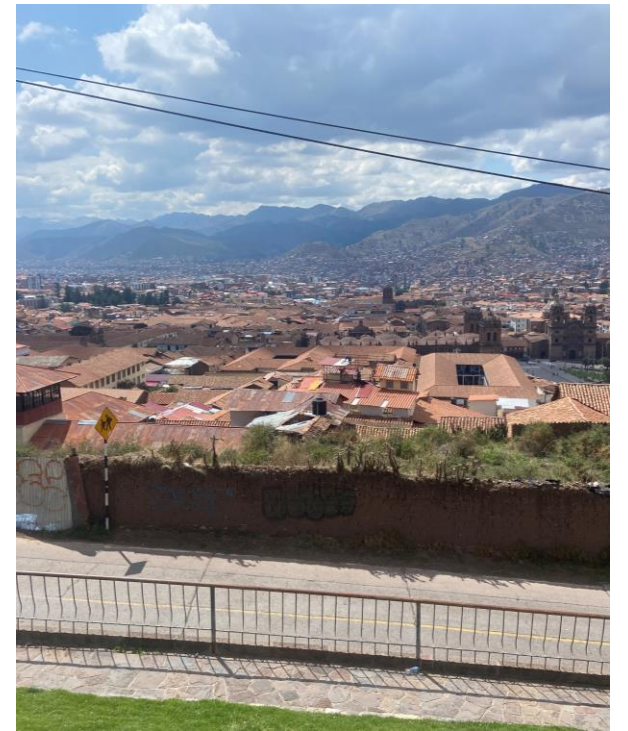
# Cusco pt. 1

# Food

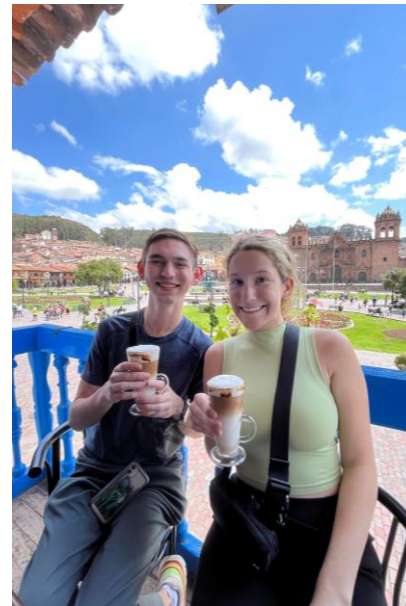
The food I ate while in Peru is unmatched compared to anywhere else, I have been. I was especially fond of the seafood and chifa.
