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

## **Cultural Differences / Advice**

- Currency in Peru is called Soles; per every 1 dollar = 3.8 soles
- Miraflores / San Isidro is a relatively safe area. Walkable to many restaurants and markets. Uber is another reliable way to get around + it is pretty cheap!
- Using a fork and knife is a must at every meal! Yes, including pizza.
- Tipping is optional. 10% is the common norm. If they ask for passport number at restaurants/shopping centers, know that it is also <u>optional</u>, and you can say no.
- Iced coffee is not common, neither is Matcha :(
- There are a couple of restaurants ranked in the top 50 list that are located in Lima, try them if you have a chance!
- UV Index is extremely high almost every day, PACK SUNSCREEN!
- At some point you will get sick, bring medicines and IV supplements. Pepto Bismol will be your best friend.
