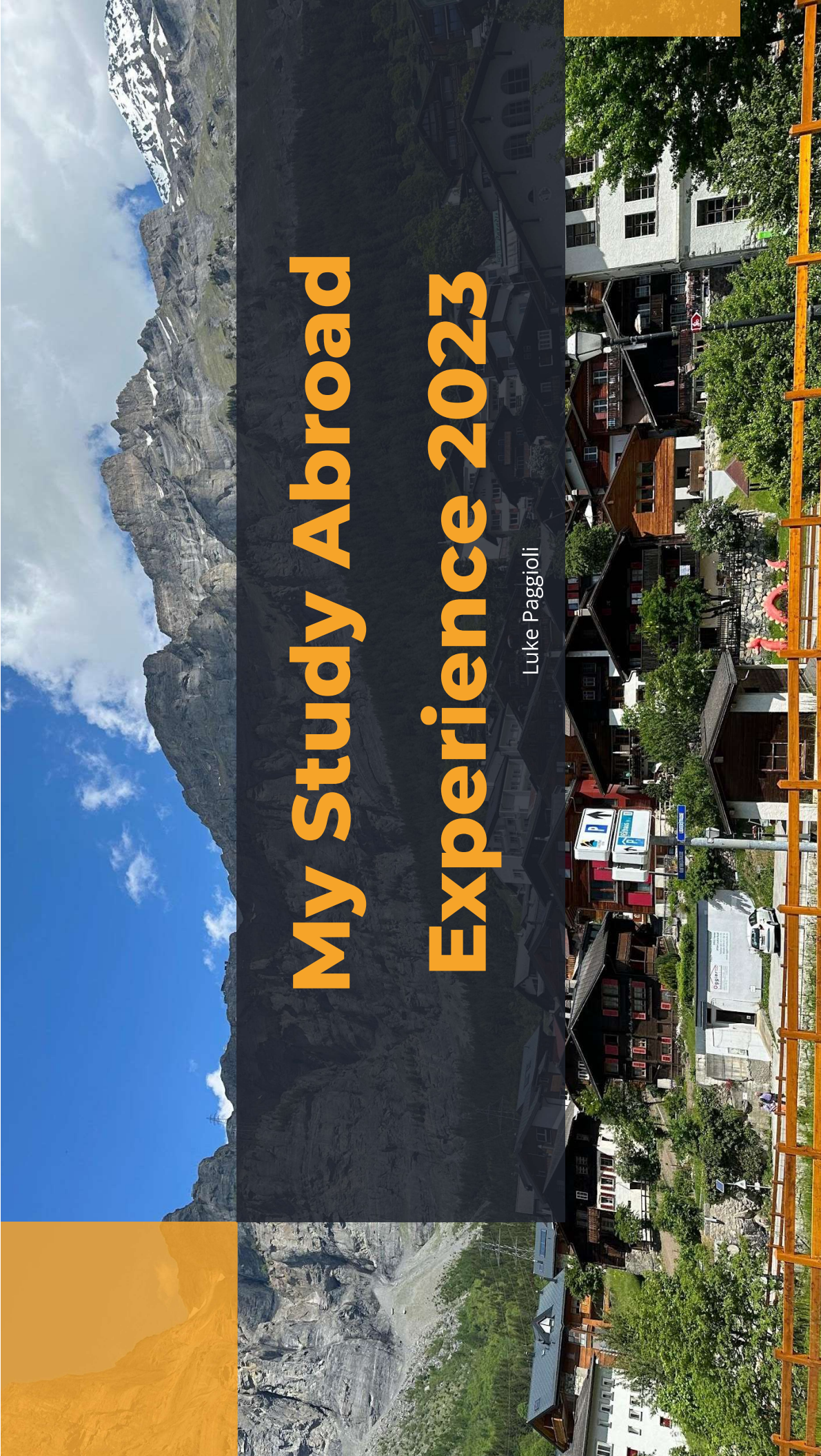


# My Study Abroad Experience 2023

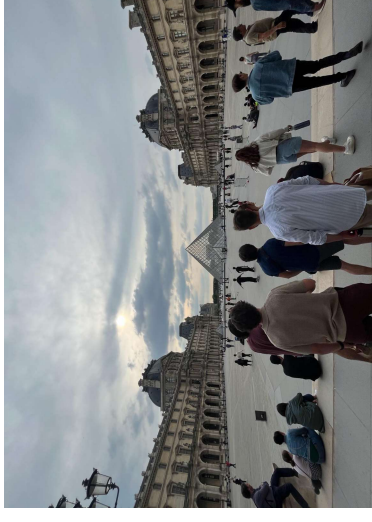

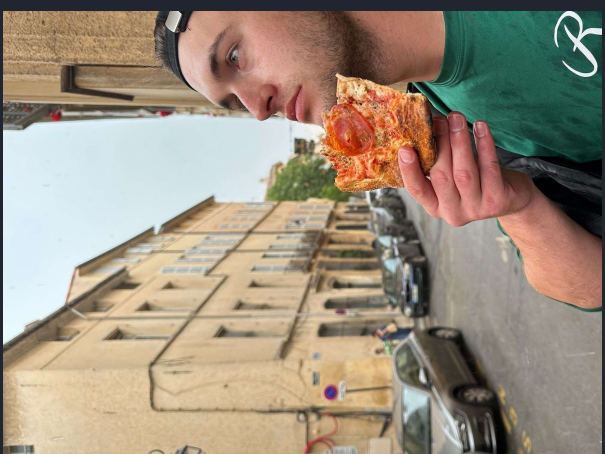
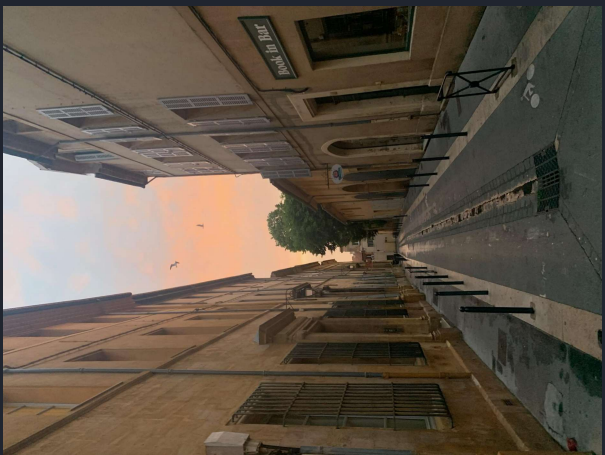
# Aix-en-Provence

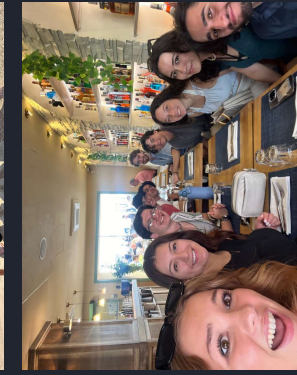
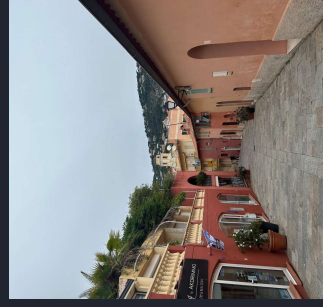
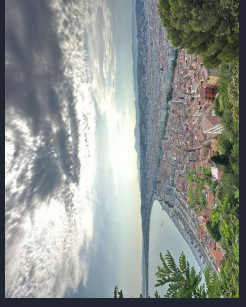




# Nice

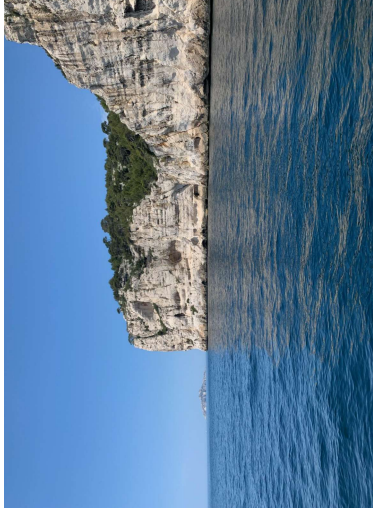
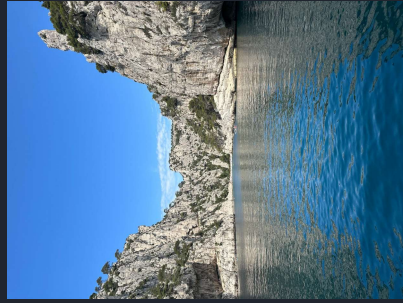

# Calanques

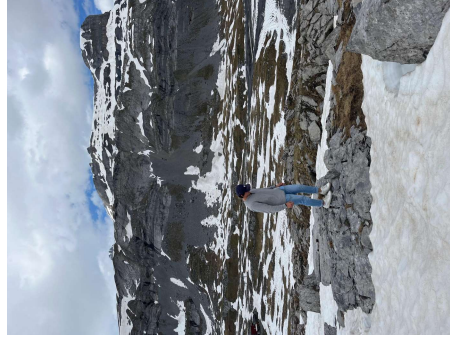
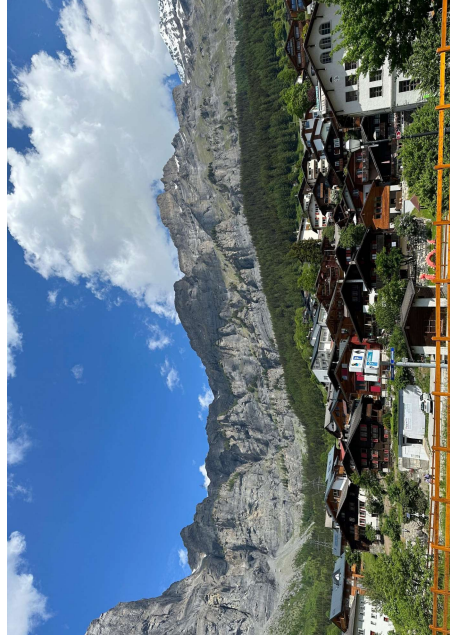
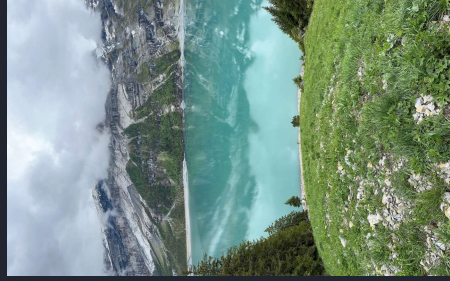
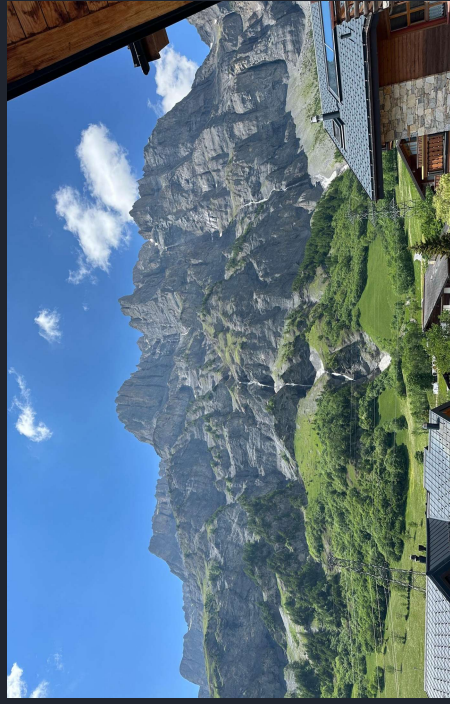

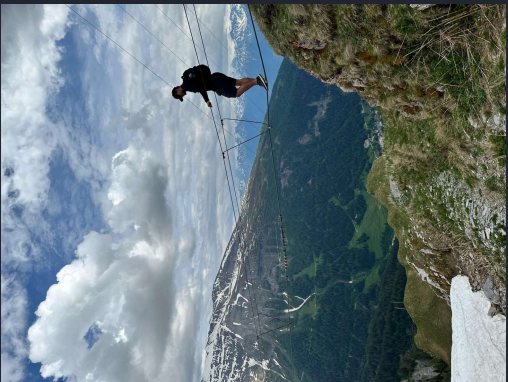
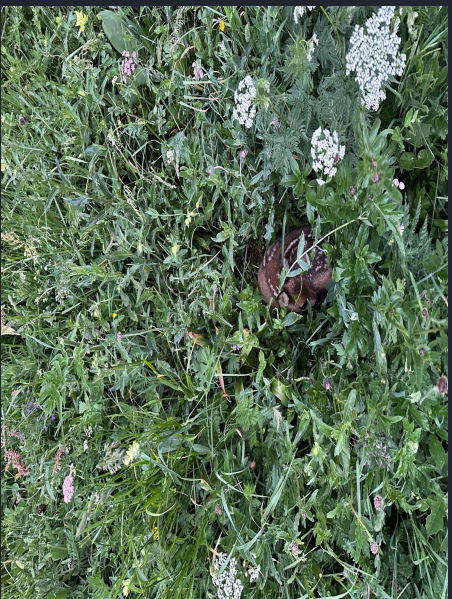
# Switzerland

# Verdon Gorge

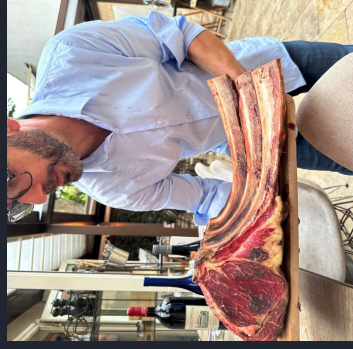

# Marseille

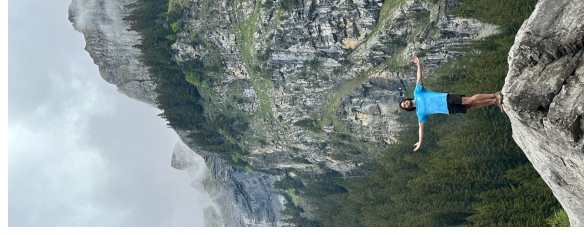
